COURT OF CRIMINAL APPEALS AFFIRMS SETTING ASIDE OF CAPITAL MURDER CONVICTION AND DEATH SENTENCE FOR ALABAMA MAN REPRESENTED BY ASHBY PATE AND RACHELLE SANCHEZ

The Alabama Court of Criminal Appeals **recently affirmed** a Jefferson Circuit Court decision in *State of Alabama v. Steven Petric*, setting aside a capital murder conviction and death sentence.

Lightfoot, Franklin & White LLC partner **R. Ashby Pate** and associate **Rachelle E. Sanchez** assisted, pro bono, with the petitioner's Rule 32 petition that led to the circuit court's original ruling. The petition argued that the defendant had been deprived of adequate legal representation. The circuit court agreed with the arguments, set aside the conviction and ordered a new trial. The State of Alabama appealed that decision, which led to the recent ruling by the Alabama Court of Criminal Appeals.

Pate and Sanchez did not assist with the appeal. That was handled by Sidley Austin LLP.
