FIRM WELCOMES INAUGURAL 'LIGHTFOOT ACADEMY' CLASS

During the program, students will engage with aspects of the litigation process, including sitting in on client and team meetings, writing briefs and motions and observing trial lawyers in action. The new program, **announced earlier this year**, is designed to encourage and support qualified, diverse students pursuing a legal education. The Lightfoot Academy is open to rising college seniors who are seriously considering law school, as well as incoming law students interested in becoming trial lawyers.
