JACK SHARMAN CO-AUTHORS ARTICLE ON ATTORNEY-CLIENT PRIVILEGE FOR ACC DOCKET

Lightfoot, Franklin & White LLC partner **Jack Sharman** recently co-authored an article for *ACC Docket* with Greg Schuetz, head of legal and compliance at Messer Americas.

The article, titled “**Global Privilege Issues**,” is the cover story for the publication’s June 2019 issue and explores the topic of attorney-client privilege in the U.S. and abroad.

“Different members of the legal community have divergent views of the attorney-client privilege and the attorney work product doctrine,” write the authors. “In general, corporate counsel, clients, and outside defense counsel have an expansive — often too expansive — view of these doctrines.”

Sharman has practiced law for more than 30 years and chairs Lightfoot’s **White-Collar Criminal Defense and Corporate Investigations** practice group. He was the former special counsel to the House Banking Committee during its Whitewater investigation of President Bill Clinton in the 1990s. In 2016, he was appointed as **special counsel to the Alabama House Judiciary Committee** for the impeachment investigation of former Alabama Governor Robert Bentley.
