## LIGHTFOOT ANNOUNCES 2022 DIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIP WINNER

Marks expressed gratitude for Lightfoot's scholarship award, which she said will help establish herself financially as she grows in the profession. She added that she is excited to return to her hometown and immerse herself in Lightfoot's summer clerkship program, which represents her first foray into litigation.

"I'm excited for the mentoring aspect of Lightfoot's summer clerkship, and look forward to learning from the firm's attorneys about their practice and journey at Lightfoot," Marks said. "I'm also excited to meet and make connections with other law students in the program."
