Lightfoot, Franklin & White LLC partners **Brandon K. Essig** and **Jack Sharman** co-authored an article published in Medical Economics titled “**Risk management lessons from an opioid trial.**”

In writing the article, Essig and Sharman drew from their recent experience in a federal “pill mill” prosecution stemming from the Drug Enforcement Agency’s “Operation Pillution” crackdown on the overprescription of opioids.

“Physicians and other practitioners who prescribe controlled substances are participating in what is perhaps the most high-risk practice of medicine today,” write Essig and Sharman. “But criminal prosecutions and civil lawsuits brought against practitioners for their prescribing practices do provide some guidance.”
