LIGHTFOOT HOSTS SECOND ANNUAL 'WHITE COLLAR INSTITUTE'

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (May 18, 2018) — For the second year in a row, Lightfoot, Franklin & White LLC has hosted its White Collar Institute featuring noted judges and lawyers from around the country who addressed topical issues of concern for in-house counsel.
