LIGHTFOOT SECURES SUMMARY JUDGMENT FOR GM IN PRODUCT LIABILITY CASE

Lightfoot, Franklin & White LLC partners **Harlan Prater** and **Rachel Lary**, along with associate **Bridget Harris**, obtained summary judgment on behalf of General Motors LLC (GM) in a product liability case pending in the Eastern District of Arkansas.

Plaintiffs alleged that a 1997 Saturn was defective and unreasonably dangerous due to alleged defects in its driver seat and frontal airbag. GM presented evidence that the vehicle met or exceeded all applicable federal motor vehicle safety standards when it was manufactured and sold, and that there was no evidence of the alleged defects. The court found that the plaintiffs failed to meet their burden of proof and dismissed each of their claims against GM.
