Modeled after **Lightfoot's summer clerkship program**, the Lightfoot Academy offers students a behind-thescenes look at life as a trial lawyer. Participants observe the litigation process firsthand, from client and team meetings to drafting legal briefs and motions and watching the firm's trial lawyers in action. Lightfoot also pairs each participant with dedicated mentors.

The week's schedule also includes interactive sessions that focus on the skills and habits essential to success in law school and in litigation practice. These educational components offer students a comprehensive understanding of the legal profession, including what it's like to practice law and how to set the groundwork for a long career.

During their week at Lightfoot, participants immerse themselves in the firm's culture and build valuable connections that can shape their professional future. The Academy also features several social events designed for the pre-law students to get to know the firm's lawyers, particularly younger associates who can offer insights into all that Lightfoot offers to those starting their legal careers.
