## LIGHTFOOT WINS SUMMARY JUDGMENT IN GEORGIA STATE COURT

Lightfoot, Franklin & White LLC partners **J. Chandler Bailey** and **Christopher C. Yearout**, along with associate Charles M. Stam, secured a summary judgment on behalf of Techtronic Industries North America, Inc., (TTI-NA) and One World Technologies, Inc. (One World) in Georgia state court.

The case involved a commercial trucking accident in Atlanta, in which the plaintiff alleged that an improperly loaded and "top heavy" cargo container shifted and caused his truck to roll over while navigating an exit ramp, causing him personal injuries. The Lightfoot team moved for summary judgment on behalf of TTI-NA and One World, arguing that the plaintiff failed to present sufficient evidence to support his claims against our clients. The trial court agreed and granted summary judgment in TTI-NA and One World's favor as to all of the plaintiff's claims.

Bailey represents product manufacturers and suppliers around the country in high-stakes cases involving catastrophic injuries and wrongful death. He has served as national and regional counsel for several of the country's largest companies, representing them in serious, high-exposure lawsuits in more than 20 states.
