LIZ HUNTLEY AWARDED AMERICAN BAR ASSOCIATION'S OUTSTANDING ACTIVITY AWARD FOR WORK WITH THE JOHNSON INSTITUTE

Lightfoot Senior Counsel and Director of Community Relations and Engagement Liz Huntley was recently recognized for her work as a board member of the Johnson Institute on a National Law Day Program executed in May 2021. Each year following Law Day on May 1st, the American Bar Association awards an individual, group or organization the "Outstanding Activity Award" for a Law Day program that educates and enriches their community.

Huntley was a featured panelist in the Johnson Institute's Program, "What is Due Process," a virtual panel for high school students to explore and understand the idea of due process and role of law in society.
