LIZ HUNTLEY HONORS AUBURN'S FIRST AFRICAN-AMERICAN STUDENT, HAROLD A. FRANKLIN, AT DEDICATION CEREMONY

Huntley was present among other notable Auburn University individuals, including chair of the Auburn University Black Alumni Council Chacolby Burns-Johnson, Harold Franklin Jr., and Auburn University President Jay Gogue.
