LIZ HUNTLEY SPEAKS AT 2018 NATIONAL FORUM ON CHARACTER

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (October 10, 2018) — Lightfoot, Franklin & White LLC of counsel **Liz Huntley** spoke at the **2018 National Forum on Character** in Washington, D.C. this past weekend. She was a keynote speaker for one of the National Schools of Character and Promising Practices Regional Lunches on October 6.

The annual event is hosted by Character.org and brings together educators, coaches, business and community leaders, and experts in character development from around the country. This year was the 25th anniversary of the forum.

Huntley also serves as a motivational speaker to various groups and organizations where she challenges audiences to adopt her “no excuses” philosophy. In 2015, she published her personal memoir, “**More Than A Bird**,” which recounts her childhood journey “from unimaginable darkness to radiance.”
