### RACHEL LARY AND AMAOBI ENYINNIA SECURE ELEVENTH CIRCUIT WIN FOR LEADING AUTOMAKER

Lightfoot, Franklin & White LLC partners **Rachel Lary** and **Amaobi J. Enyinnia** secured a win from the Eleventh Circuit Court of Appeals, affirming a lower court's dismissal of a product liability case in Georgia against a major automotive manufacturer.

The lawsuit stemmed from an incident in which the plaintiff sustained an eye injury during a 2017 car accident, alleging the vehicle's glass was defective. The plaintiff sued the automaker four years after the accident in Georgia state court, and Lightfoot removed it to federal court. Plaintiff's multiple amendments and additions to the complaint were met with strategic opposition from the Lightfoot team, who successfully argued for dismissal on the grounds of an expired statute of limitations.

The district court's decision to dismiss the case was challenged on appeal. The plaintiff contended that the district court erred by incorrectly applying Georgia's discovery tolling rule and requested the appellate court apply Georgia Code § 9-3-99 regarding the tolling of the statute of limitations in tort cases where a related criminal prosecution is possible but has not commenced. However, the Eleventh Circuit's three-judge panel unanimously upheld the district court's ruling, affirming the dismissal of the case and finding no error in the district court's dismissal of the plaintiff's complaint.
